



English

Our English topic this term is all about poetry. The children will be reading a selection of poems and writing their own acrostic and list poems. They will be researching about animals online and using their knowledge to write poems about animals. The children will also be exploring rhyming words.



Maths

In Maths, the children will be continuing their work about number. They will learn about Fact Families and related facts (see image below). They will then move on to learning about addition and subtraction and comparing number sentences.



Science

In Science we are learning about everyday materials. We will be considering the properties of different materials.

The children will conduct an investigation to find out which material is best for absorbing water and which materials are waterproof.



Theme

In Art this term, we are learning about the artist Henry Moore. The children will find out about Henry's life and explore his unusual sculptures. The children will also have an opportunity to design and make their own sculpture with clay, taking inspiration from the work of Henry Moore.

In Music, the children will be learning about Peter and the Wolf, composed by Sergei Prokofiev. They will find out about the instruments that represent each animal and have an opportunity to performing their own music inspired by the story.





<u>PE</u>

In PE this term, the children will be learning how to play football. They will learn the fundamental skills of passing, dribbling and shooting and developing an understanding of the rules in a game situation.



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R.E

In RE this term, we will be learning that Christians believe Jesus brings good news for all people. For Christians, this good news means they are loved by God and forgiven for bad things they do. The children will explore how Christians believe Jesus is a friend to the poor and the friendless. They will consider how Jesus' teachings influence how Christians live their lives.



Woodland

In Woodland this term, the focus is problem-solving and team building. The children will have opportunities to work on their communication skills and put these into practice to complete team challenges.



PSHE/RSE

In RSE this term, we are learning about how children grow and change. We will learn that babies and young children need a lot of care and that older children become more independent.

We will also be thinking about some differences between male and female animals. The children will learn that a new life needs a male and a female.
